REB Requirements for Course-based Pedagogical Activities

Dear Colleagues,

Tri-Council Policy Statement: Ethical Conduct for Research Involving Humans ("TCPS 2"), article 2.1 indicates that pedagogical, course-based research activities are subject to REB oversight. Western's REBs acknowledge that part of the pedagogical objective of teaching research methods within the context of a course should provide students with the relevant research ethics training to conduct research in that discipline.

As you may recall, the Office of Human Research Ethics (OHRE) developed a guidance document-<u>REB Requirements for Student Research and Pedagogical Activities</u>, that provides an overview of course-based pedagogical projects. It outlines requirements for submitting these student activities and associated procedures for ethical oversight when these activities involve human participants (including data and/or biological materials). We encourage each faculty to review this guidance document and to develop your own internal processes for ensuring REB requirements are met.

As a reminder, since January 2020, all pedagogical projects considered to fall within Category 2, as per the guidance document. **Course instructors are required to submit a 'Pedagogical Initial Application' via WREM for review and acknowledgment prior to initiating the assignment.** As part of the review process, **Principal Investigators/Course Instructors** may receive feedback from the OHRE requesting updates to the application and/or project documents to ensure compliance with applicable guidelines and regulations. Acknowledgment is issued for one year.
